Admission Process:

Pre-Admission Procedure (Early Year 1 To A Level/IBDP)

Step 1		Complete the online Application Form / Contact the Admissions Team
Step 2	1	Scheduling of a play-date and/or assessment
Step 3		School Tour and Interaction with the Principal and Primary program coordinator.
Step 4		The Admissions Department will write to you with the outcome of your application and Fee payment

Post Admission Procedures

Once the student secures the admission, parents/guardians are required to deposit the fees and submit the following documents.

- Original transfer certificate (International students will be required to provide a letter from the principal of the last institution attended stating the bonafide of the student along with the report of the last examination taken).
- Photocopy of the Passport (Mandatory for international students).
- Once the fee and documents are submitted, guardians will receive a confirmation mail from the school. This email will include a guide to further formalities including the fee deposit procedure.
- After the admission formalities have been completed and fees have been paid the parents/guardian will receive a welcome mail from the coordinator with details of classes and book procurement etc.
- Parents/Guardians shall be responsible for informing the school about the joining date of their ward.
- The student has to be dropped off at the school by the parent/guardian on the first day.
- Parents/Guardians and the student need to sign the school Code of Conduct
- In the case of students with special needs a Special Needs Undertaking needs to be signed by theparents/guardian.
- For any further query, guardians can contact the school front desk.

SUBJECT CHOICES:

After securing admission in middle school, students are expected to study the compulsory subjects offered in the school which are English as a first language, Hindi, French, Science, Mathematics, Social Sciences and ICT. However, the level of a third language is decided based on the student's prior knowledge of the language.

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For IGCSE/A Levels/IBDP students and parents are requested to indicate their subject preferences by completing the subject choice form. The school does not guarantee that students will get all the chosen subjects.

Students go through detailed counseling sessions with the Cambridge program coordinator, school career counselor, and specialist career counselor associated with the school for choosing subjects for A Level courses depending upon their interest and university requirements.

SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS:

As per our Admission policy for SEN Students, we ensure that in case a child needs any special care or any specific need, it must be mentioned at the time of admission. (Written information clearly supplied in the admission forms).

In a situation where the School feels unable to provide or make available any specialist help required due to a lack of resources parents/guardians would be immediately informed.

If a student is applying for admission and has already been identified as having special educational needs, any results of prior testing and/ or existing Individual Education Plans (IEPs) need to be provided to the Admissions Office with the application. Applications will not be processed until all supporting documentation has been submitted and the school can make an informed decision as to whether it can meet the student's needs or not. Submit previous academic records (if applicable).

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

The school accepts students who started the A level, IGCSE, Cambridge middle years at other schools, only on the condition that the subjects they studied in their previous school are currently being offered by Amity Global School, Noida. However, transfer students need to submit reports and/or a letter from their previous school which confirms that he/she was pursuing a particular program.

LANGUAGE PROFILE:

A language profiling of the students is done, and teachers of all subjects are made to understand their rolein supporting student language development. As AGSN as a school fully understands and supports the needs of students for whom the language of instruction in the school is not their best or first language.

SCHOLARSHIP POLICY:

AGSN offers Scholarships to meritorious students*. The division is as follows, (Only for Grade 6 onwards based on the entrance exam of the school)

80%-85% 10% Annual tuition fee

- 85%-95% 15% Annual tuition fee
- 96%-100%. 20% Annual tuition fee

*Subject to change as per management discretion.

REVIEW AND IMPLEMENTATION OF ADMISSION POLICY:

Annex 2: The list of subjects currently offered in the IGCSE:

English as a first language Hindi as a second language/French as a Foreign language Mathematics ICT Physics/Economics Chemistry/Business Studies Biology/ Geography/ Art and Design/Combined science

Students are expected to take at least one subject from each group and a total of 7 subjects. (Although, to study in India a minimum of 5 subjects is the requirement). English and Mathematics are made mandatory in the school.

A Level students need to study 3 to 4 A level subjects and 1AS English. The following subjects are offered at AGSN

English General Paper Physics Chemistry Biology Economics Business Mathematics Psychology Hindi Geography Art and Design



Students go through detailed counselling session with the Cambridge programme coordinator, school career counsellor and specialist career counsellor associated with the school for choosing subjects for A Level courses depending upon their interest and university requirements.

Annex 3: List of proposed subjects for IBDP upon Authorization:

The subjects being offered in various groups at Higher and Standard Level are:

- Group 1 Studies in Language and Literature: English Language and Literature and Hindi Literature
- Group 2 Language acquisition: English B, Hindi B and French abinitio
- Group 3 Individuals and societies: Business Management, Economics, ITGS and Psychology.
- Group 4 Sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Environmental Systems and Societies
- Group 5 Mathematical analysis and approaches and Mathematical application and interpretation
- Group 6 Arts: Visual Arts

Students choose one subject from each group. In case a student does not want to do Group 6 subject then s/he can choose a second subject from group 3 or group 4. For Diploma Programme students need 6 subjects – 3 Higher Level and 3 Standard Level.

Apart from this students will also fulfil completion of the CORE aspects – Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Extended Essay (EE) and Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) in order to acquire the Diploma.

Students go through detailed counselling session with Diploma Programme Coordinator, school Career Counsellor and Head – Amity Career Counselling & Guidance Cell associated with the school for choosing subjects depending upon their interest and university requirements.


